After experiencing total destruction of its urban area by the atomic bombing on August 6, 1945, Hiroshima rose from the ruins to establish itself as an "International City of Peace and Culture." It has continued to evolve as a beautiful metropolis with abundant greenery and rich culture that aims to make significant contributions to peace throughout the world.



Hiroshima City University

Hiroshima City University is a public university, opened in 1994 with the objective of becoming a higher education institution appropriate for an international city of peace and culture. The Faculty of International Studies is one of the three original faculties.



Summer Program Overview

Hiroshima is not merely a site memorializing its tragic atomic bombing in the last century, but a dynamic city, where students from diverse backgrounds can come together to study and discuss issues related to world peace.

The aim of this summer program "HIROSHIMA and PEACE" (H&P) is to provide students with a general understanding of the nature and attributes of war and peace by illuminating various aspects of wartime experiences, including the atomic bombing of Hiroshima, and, at the same time, to explore contemporary issues related to world peace today.

In addition to the lectures, the program will feature several special activities, including visits to the Atomic Bomb Dome and Peace Memorial Museum, attendance at the Peace Memorial Ceremony on August 6th, visit to the mayor of Hiroshima, and discussion with atomic bomb survivors.

Participants will receive a certificate from Hiroshima City University upon successfully completing the summer program.

Eligibility: The course is designed primarily for undergraduate and graduate students (in master's and doctoral programs), who seek to gain a deeper knowledge of the importance of realizing peace by participating in lectures, discussions, and featured programs.

Language: The course will be conducted in English, so participants need to have a good command of spoken and written English.

Course Assessment: Both undergraduate and graduate students are eligible to earn two credits through the course. Students' grades for the course will be based on the quality of their participation in the classes and activities, as well as their performance in a group project task – where they will have the opportunity to show the knowledge and perspectives they have gained during the program.
